OKOBOJI FOOD PANTRY

Thanks to several generous individuals and groups in our community, our Okoboji Food Pantry is positioned to serve our community several times a month. People from across the county experience the benefit of having their physical resources met, and during the pandemic we were one of very few pantries open to our greater community.

ESTHERVILLE MOBILE FOOD BANK

The Estherville Mobile Food Bank is a free food service to those within Emmet County and regularly serves around 500 people a month. Our food service provider, the Iowa Food Bank, speaks highly of the organization of the efforts in Estherville, particularly through the work of Linda Prince (Good News staff), and Brett Fuelberth (ILCC faculty).



'The first thing to understand about the Benevolence fund is that it's meant to be spent. The Bible is clear that God's gift of salvation was extended to all of us long before any of us were deserving of it (Romans 5:8). That aspect of God's character should be reflected when the Benevolence fund helps satisfy someone's need in a time of crisis. There are specific, approved uses of the fund, and there are several prohibited uses, but never let that be confused with deservedness. And, while there are financial limits in the Benevolence policy, we must remember that every resource – material and immaterial, inside and outside the church – is already God's (Psalm 24:1). Therefore, when we fill a request, it is not the church's money being spent, but rather God's grace and love being extended through us in the form of financial assistance.'

Where are we headed?

WHY THE CHURCH?

God's mission is saving the world through His Son, Jesus. The church is the instrument through which God carries out His mission. The church is not called on to decide whether she will carry on the mission or not -- she can only decide whether she wants to be the church.

OUR 2022 THEME: CULTIVATE

To cultivate is to break up the soil in preparation for sowing or planting. God is calling the church to join in on the labor of preparing for harvest. Jesus said the fields 'are white for harvest,' (John 4:35) and we are to prepare ourselves, and others, to do the dirty work of planting seeds, watering others in the living water of Jesus, and establish our own roots deep in Christ.
